To review the literature on the efficacy and safety of endoscopic nasal valve surgery (END-NV). A systematic literature review was performed. MEDLINE, EMBASE, and Cochrane databases were searched for all studies published on END-NV until June 2018. The search was limited to studies in English and studies including patients with septal deviation (SD). Study quality was assessed by using an adapted version of the Quality Assessment Tool for Diagnostic Accuracy Studies and Quality Assessment of Controlled Intervention Studies. Thirty-one studies were included. Mean follow-up time of patients included in the systematic review was 24 months. The studies included 1,815 patients. Seventy-two percent of patients had a septoplasty with turbinoplasty (STPT). Eight percent of patients had a septorhinoplasty and 10% had a sinus lift. Overall success was 88.1% (range, 65%-100%). The success rate for nasal endoscopy was 97.1% (range, 90%-100%) in studies with an average follow-up period of 12 months. The complication rate was 1.2% (range, 0%-5.6%). Common complications included perforation (1.2%) and epistaxis (0.6%). Thirteen studies included patients with SD. The success rate of END-NV was 94.1% (range, 82%-100%) and was superior to the success rate of the open approach (73%).
